Episode 1: Jamie Coates-Chinese students in Japan

In this episode, <u>Dr Jamie Coates</u> discusses the key findings of his documentary film '<u>Tokyo Pengyou</u>' and his recent journal article '<u>The Cruel Optimism of Mobility</u>' in <u>positions</u> journal. He reveals anecdotes and key challenges in making the film and publishing the article. He also looks forward to his book and grant application based on this research project.

Episode 2: Shuning Liu — New 'Elite' Schooling in China

In this episode, <u>Dr Shuning Liu</u> (Ball State University, US) discusses key findings, empirical experiences and future plans about her latest book '<u>Neoliberalism</u>, <u>Globalization</u>, <u>and "Elite" Education in China</u>'. She also reveals anecdotes when conducting her fieldwork in a public high school in China, relating to her insider/outsider positionality and her habit of wearing a back pack. Shuning also looks forward to her upcoming articles and a second book based on follow-up research conducted in relation to this research project.

Episode 3: Yeow-Tong Chia and Zhenzhou Zhao: Citizenship and Education in China

In this episode, guest editors <u>Dr Yeow-Tong Chia</u> (University of Sydney) and <u>Dr Zhenzhou Zhao</u> (Education University of Hong Kong) discuss their new special issue on '<u>Citizenship and Education in China</u>' published in <u>Chinese Education & Society</u>. They discuss how they conceived of this special issue, invited authors to contribute and reviewers to peer-review the submitted manuscripts. They note the gaps in literature on Civic Education in and of China and thank the contributors and peer reviewers for making great contribution to scholarship.

Episode 4: Ben Mulvey: International student mobility between Africa and China

In this episode, Ben discusses his latest research on international student mobility between Africa and China. This is based on his two latest articles published in <u>Higher Education Policy</u> and <u>Higher Education</u>. Ben discusses his motivation for conducting research in this area, based on his previous experiences of studying and working in various parts of China. He also reveals some tips for publishing as a PhD candidate and reflects on the 'publish or perish' cultural context in Hong Kong.
