- 8. <u>Dr Jingran Yu</u> (Southern University of Science and Technology, China) examines <u>Chinese students' perceptions and experiences in consuming UK transnational higher education in <u>China</u>. This is based on her recent <u>article</u> published in <u>Sociological Research Online</u>.</u>
- Dr Lisa Yiu (University of Hong Kong) discusses educational injustice induced by high-stake testing through expounding on the academic experiences of rural migrant children in Shanghai's public schools. This is based on her recent article published in Comparative Education Review.
