In this episode, the NRCEM (<u>Miss Tong Meng</u>) interviewed <u>Dr Jiaxin Chen</u> (The Hong Kong Polytechnic University) about her latest book: <u>Class consciousness construction of rural migrant children in China</u> (2022, Routledge).
